MPhil Stream

Students are required to complete a minimum of 36 units for graduation, including a minimum of 12 units of lecture courses and 24 units of thesis research courses.

PhD Stream

Students are required to complete a minimum of 60 units for graduation, including a minimum of 12 units of lecture courses and 48 units of thesis research courses.

Students are required to take thesis research course every term till they graduate.

PhD applicants should submit a copy of Master's thesis or a representative research paper and a research proposal. In addition, shortlisted applicants are required to attend an interview.
